### Withdrawal of application for marine dumping consent (EEZ100015)

1. On 25 March 2020, Coastal Resources Limited (CRL) formally withdrew its application for a marine dumping consent to dump up to 250,000m<sup>3</sup> of dredged material from source sites within Auckland and Waikato, at an existing dump site 25km east of Great Barrier Island.
2. As the application has been withdrawn, the Decision-making Committee will not be undertaking any further work to reconsider the application following the High Court's decision.
3. The DMC acknowledges it has requested the EPA to provide copies of iwi management plans from various iwi (under s56 of the Act) where available, to better understand the cultural values and iwi perspectives within the region. The EPA received this information from Auckland Council and sought consent from the relevant iwi to make the information available to the DMC, parties and for it to be published on the CRL application page on the EPA website.
4. Responses from Ngātiwai Trust, Ngāti Rehua - Ngātiwai Ki Aotea Trust and Ngāi Tai ki Tāmaki Tribal Trust to make this information available were due on Friday 27 March 2020. These responses are no longer required.
5. The DMC thanks those who were involved in the process and extends its best wishes to all during the COVID-19 State of Emergency.
