- Ngāti Tamaterā with other Hauraki Iwi are kaitiaki of the area affected by this proposal (transportation route and disposal site)
- To my knowledge there has been no engagement by the applicant with Ngāti Tamaterā.
- It is unclear what consideration has been given to the fisheries interests of Pare Hauraki
- There are some treaty settlement instruments that ought to be considered in the decision-making process.
- The transportation and disposal of dredged materials will have negative impacts on taonga species and places of cultural significance to Ngāti Tamaterā.
- Disposal of dredged materials at sea is an unsustainable practice to Ngāti Tamaterā and should be stopped.
- Alternative land-based disposal options in the locality of the dredging activity should be properly investigated.
