

EEZ100016: Tamarind Taranaki Limited marine consent and marine discharge consent applications – Tui Field

Summary of evidence of Frank Lyle Broomhead (operations)

7 November 2018

I am a Senior Operations Consultant employed by Oil & Gas Solutions (OGS) Pty Ltd, Perth, Western Australia.

I have the qualifications and experience as set out in section 1.0 – Introduction and Summary of the following OGS reports:

- > Assessment Report, No. D0010-OPS-REP-GN-0001 dated 22/05/2018.
- > Review of Evidence Statements against Key Questions, No. D0010-OPS-REP-GN-0002 dated 30/08/2018.

I undertook an operational technical review and analysis on information specified in the Tamarind Marine Consent application no. EEZ100016 including in relation to:

- > Operational activities associated with the Application
- > Installation, operation and removal of a semi-submersible Mobile Offshore Drilling Unit (MODU)
- > Activities associated with logistics
- > Activities that occur during well drilling, servicing and well commissioning
- > Discharges of water from processing drainage from hazardous and non-hazardous deck drains on the drilling rig

In reading the Application and Statements of Non-Expert Evidence for Tamarind, my final assessment report resulted in 24 questions being assigned a significance level to guide the Board of Inquiry in obtaining answers from the Applicant. At that stage of the proceedings, no MODU had been contracted and therefore detailed information was not available.

A response was received from Tamarind to these questions, including the name of the preferred semi-submersible rig to be secured for the work outlined in the marine consent Application. I reviewed the evidence statements and closed out 13 questions based on the appropriate management/operational plans to be put in place to achieve compliance.

Further communication took place with Iain Alistair McCallum (Tamarind Drilling Manager) on the 11 questions that were still outstanding. Based on further points of clarification he provided, and acceptable mitigating measures to be applied by Tamarind, my 11 remaining questions were resolved.

The process and results were conveyed to the facilitator during the Expert videoconference, which took place on 19 September 2018.

Based on the evidence supplied by Tamarind, its commitment to progress the issues to a satisfactory conclusion and record and manage these as part of its business processes, I have no remaining issues of concern or uncertainty with Application Reference No. EEZ100016.
