Notice of Hearing Dates and Venue

1. The EPA gives notice under Schedule 4 clause 6 of the Exclusive Economic Zone and Continental Shelf (Environmental Effects) Act 2012 that the Board of Inquiry will conduct a hearing on the Tamarind applications for marine consent and marine discharge consent for development drilling activities in the Tui Field, offshore Taranaki.
2. The hearing is scheduled to commence on **Tuesday 6 November 2018** at **1.00pm** in the Blenheim Room, at the Quality Hotel Plymouth International, corner of Courtenay and Leach Streets, New Plymouth. The hearing will continue during the following week until it is completed or as further advised by the Board of Inquiry.
3. The hearing may begin with a mihi whakatu and an opening statement from the Chair.
