In its present form I strongly oppose plan change 7. To issue shorter term consents is short sighted and will only increase the competition for water. Rural Otago will end up competing for water even more if this plan proceeds. To get whole of community input with good environmental outcomes then the Council needs to listen to groups such as Kyeburn Catchment. It took over 10 years for our group to obtain a new global consent.
