Amend proposed Rule change 7 to say that current water use data is able to be used in negotiating the new water permit(s) and not reliant on historic data as planned. The current proposal is biased against new property owners and new measuring devices having been recently installed to gather proper data. Amend proposed Rule change 7 to say that current water use data can be used to determine the new permit(s) and exiting water take volumes are recognized in the new permit assuming the impact on the environment is less than minor. The permits to be valid until 2035.

I want policy rule change 7 amended because the proposed rule change does not fit the model of the current water take and use for the Bannockburn area generally. It is detrimental to the economical viability of the current users properties. The Bannockburn area totally relies on the current water takes and use of the water to sustain the economic viability of a vast number of families and business's. No one has the mandate or right to destroy peoples lives unnecessarily and the very existence in this valley and based on the last 100 years or more there is no reason to change anything except create new water permits based on their current use. Existing water takes/permits should be able to use current data for new permits as in our case we have only owned the property for two years and historic data is not fully valid. The areas that have been irrigated in the past be retained on the new permit(s).
